Anselm Adornes (1424-1483), merchant, diplomat, humanist patron of the arts, explorer, and pilgrim, is a pivotal figure in the cultural history of fifteenth century Western Europe. His significance as a trusted advisor to James III of Scotland and Charles the Bold of Burgundy and his agency and influence within dynamic intellectual and artistic networks has, to date, not received the scholarly attention it deserves. The Trinity Network project aims to bring together international researchers in order to gain new perspectives on Anselm Adornes.
